
We aim for every child to have at least 97% attendance over the year.

Welcome

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome our new families to school. Your children will be happy here and will en joy lots of exciting adventures.

Uniform and Jewellery

Our children look so smart in their new uniform! Many thanks to all our families for supporting our uniform policy and keeping on top of it. Please make sure all items are labelled with your children's names so that lost items can be returned. Wearing the correct uniform is an expectation of every school and many workplaces. It is important that children begin to learn the importance of wearing the correct clothing as this will also be expected in secondary school and when our children begin working!

We ask that our children do not wear earrings to school. The no earring rule has been in place for many years, under the previous head teacher, and is now being consistently reinforced by all our school staff. Although our other local primary schools do allow this, they insist that earrings are removed for PE and physical activities. Most secondary schools have a 'no earring' policy.

In our school we ask children not to wear them to:

- Not waste time removing earrings or to risk losing them
- Ensure that children are safe during physical activity
- Stop any unnecessary distractions during class based lessons

Thank you for your cooperation in helping our children to follow school rules. Children who continue to wear earrings may not be allowed out at break or lunchtimes until they are removed.

Attendance

Last week, we were delighted that our school attendance was 97.5% (our target is 97%). Please remember if your child is going to be absent from school please phone the office before 9.00a.m. If you fail to report your child's absence, it is our policy to make a home visit. If your child needs to visit the Doctor or Dentist, please make the appointment for after school, so that they are not missing their education.
