

## Literacy Development

- Read the story 'Supertato' by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet. If you don't have a copy at home, you can find the audio book with pictures on YouTube. Talk with your child about what has happened in the story.
- Make a list of the fruits and vegetables that children can identify in the story. Ask your child - *What is your favourite fruit? What is your favourite vegetable? etc*
- Play 'I went to the shops and I bought...' game. One person starts by saying "I went to the shops and I bought a \*add item here\*". The next person must repeat, remembering to say the first item before adding their own, and so on.

## Mathematical Development

- Encourage your child to count the correct amount of peas on to a plate (focus on numbers 1-6). You could use actual peas or scrunched up pieces of paper. Encourage your child to take their time as they count each pea!
- Using a vegetable such as a potato and some paint, encourage your child to create prints by dipping them in the paint. If you have more than one colour or more than one vegetable can you make a repeating pattern?
