- If you still haven't had a chance, remember to make your friends and family a special Easter card that could be posted. Mathematical Development

- Cut out some large oval shapes (to look like Easter eggs) and number them 0-6. Hide them around the house and allow your child to go on an egg hunt. Can they find the eggs and put them in the correct order.
- Have a sort out of your child's sock drawer. Put up a piece of string or rope and provide your child with a basket of pegs (if the weather is nice, you could do this outside using your washing line!) Jumble up all of your child's socks and encourage them to put them together in pairs. Allow them to use the pegs to peg them together on the line. How many pairs do they have altogether?
