We also began our science topic 'Everyday Materials' and our geography work on 'Our Local Area'. In RE, we talked about our families, how they are all different but all show love to one another. We have had a fabuous first week back in Year Two. I have loved getting to know all of the children and have been very touched by the warm welcome that I have received I am very excited for the year ahead. As part of our "Women of Courage" week, we have written a biography and created portraits of Malala Yousafzai. In mathe we have applied known facts to develop number sense, created new facts from number bonds and recognised the value of each digit in a 2-digit number. In R.E we have started our new topic 'Homes' and it was a pleasure reading children's work on their 'Home Sweet Home'. Children really enjoyed looking at Google Earth to identify mountains in the UK in our geography topic "Settlements and Land Use in the UK'. Year 3 P.E will be on Mondays and Tuesdays. <u>Year 4</u>

What an amazing first week back in school! Year 4 have really settled back into class and it has been lovely to learn more about all the children. As a class we have enjoyed learning all about Harriet Tubman during 'Women of Courage' week. The children were fascinated by the underground railway system and admired her bravery for helping so many people. In Maths, we have developed our understanding of place value and comparing numbers using greater or less than symbols. We had a great time on Thursday morning with our first singing lesson, it was lovely to see all the children participating. We also continued to develop our language skills in Spanish, with our first Spanish lesson of the school year! It has been a jam-packed week with lots of hard work from all!

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

All children in Reception, YI and Y2 get free school meals regardless of parents' income. If parents receive certain benefits, school may qualify for extra funding known as Pupil Premium. We need to know that you're entitled to Free School Meals to issue vouchers during school holidays. NURSERY PLACES AVAILABLE

If you would like to put your child's name down for a space in Nursery, please complete a purple form available from the school office.

SAFEGUARDING/MENTAL HEALTH

Regular school attendance is an important part of giving children the best possible start in life. Attendance as always, is high on our agenda so expect high challenge from the start with regards to any absences!

Of course, we know children do get ill from time to time but would urge you to only keep your children off if they are genuinely too unwell for school....calpol, tissues and plenty to drink can work wonders. Did you know....Primary aged children where school attendance is 75% or less over an academic year halves the possibility of achieving the age related expectation for a child at the end of KS3.
