Nursery

Welcome to the start of a brand new term in Nursery. We hope this year brings you and your family lots of health and happiness! We have started our NELI programme this week. This aims to support children's vocabulary development and create a love

of books. Each week, I will be sending out a newsletter based on our new story. Please check our

Teams page for this. Our text this week has been 'Neon Leon'. A story about a chameleon who couldn't change colour. Within each book there are 'special words' for us to focus on and base lots of activities around. This week, two of the words were match and hide. We have played lots of matching games and

spoke about how our uniforms match! We played hide and seek outside and lots of the children said this is a favourite at home too!

Reception

We have had a fantastic first week back in Reception. The children have confidently settled in to our new routines with ease making us extremely proud. In maths we have explored numbers within 10 and have been working hard to count objects within a picture. They continue to blow our staff away with how well they use full sentences to describe how many of each object they can see. We now have new Read Write Inc groups and the children are making superb progress. Remember at home to keep 'Fred Talking' as much as possible with your child. For example, "put on your h-a-t", "take off your s-o-ck". Our new home learning will be sent home on Monday to support your child with their reading. Please return this on a Friday so that we have time to change the challenge.

<u>Year l</u>

What a lovely first week back in Year I. I have loved welcoming the children back into class. Their energy, enthusiasm and kindness has really brought a smile to my face. In our English lessons, we read 'Ten Little Pirates', talked about our favourite games, who we play them with and how boys and girls can play together. The children's knowledge of the months of the year has really impressed me this week. They were able to name and sing a song about the months

and they loved making paper chains showing the order of the months. In our history work, we finished off our work on toys from the past and we met Mr MacKenzie's lion teddy which he had as a baby – a

46 year old teddy! We enjoyed celebrating the Epiphany on Friday and made Christingles as our gifts for the baby Jesus. Happy New Year everyone!

<u>Year 2</u>

We have had a wonderful first week back in Year 2 and I hope everybody is settling back into the school routine. It is lovely to see all of the children back and ready to learn. In maths we have started to multiply and divide using manipulatives. The children have been confidendently using mathematical vocabulary to explain how they have solved their problems. In English, we have been writing using expanded roun phrases and exploring the past and present tense. We have started our new science topic 'Habitats' and enjoyed exploring how to classify if something is living, dead or never lived. A polite reminder that new reading folders go home on Monday. Please ensure that your child's bookbag is returned by then, Thank you for your continued support in this. Happy New Year!

<u>Year 3</u>

It has been wonderful to welcome our children back and, we hope you all had a great Christmas break. In maths, we have been recalling multiplication and division facts and using the inverse method to understand these operations. It is important for all children to practise their multiplication tables and access TT Rockstars daily. In English, we have started our new text

'The Magic Finger' by Roald Dahl and it is fantastic to see how mesmerised the children are with the story already. We had great fun marking significant events in our lives on a calendar in our new R.E topic 'Journeys'. In science, we have looked at the process of fossilisation and in history we have compared Pre-historic Britain to some of the world's earliest civilisations. A polite reminder that homework must be returned every Friday.

<u>Year 4</u>

A brilliant first week back in Year 4! It has been lovely to welcome all the children back into school.

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas. In maths, we have revised our knowledge of different multiplication tables in preparation for this term's topic 'fractions'. In English, we have started a new

class text, 'The Angel of Nitshill Road'. The children have begun to create detailed descriptions of the main characters within the narrative. It was wonderful to hear the children in Spanish; their confidence has grown so much over the first term, and they have now moved onto their next topic 'weather'. Finally, we began a new RE topic and answered the big question: What makes a community? The children had some great ideas and shared lovely thoughts about their own communities.

PE AT ST AMBROSE

What a great first week back in school! Each class has started their new topics for this half term. EYFS are learning gymnastics and KSI started send and return games. Years 3 and 4 began dodgeball and Years 5 and 6 start tennis next week! Please remember that children should only wear their school PE kit on their class' specific PE days.

<u>Year 5</u>

We have had a great first week back after our Christmas break. After a few sleepy faces on Tuesday, the children have quickly settled back into our class routine. It has been wonderful to see children arriving on time and in the correct school uniform. In science, we investigated the different forces that act on an object in water. We learnt that water resistance pushes back against an object in water and slows it down. We used plasticine to create a range of different shapes and investigate how streamlined shapes are able to move through water more easily. A reminder that swimming lessons recommence on Thursday 12th January, so children will need to have the correct kit for this day. Have a great weekend everyone!

<u>Year 6</u>

We have enjoyed our first week back after Christmas, with a great attitude to learning, as children settle into our 'new look classroom'. We have started to look at angles, using mathematical vocabulary to reason our explanations. We have also started to read 'Journey to Jo'burg', by Beverley Naidoo, a story that tells the reader of life in South Africa, for two young children, during Aparteid. 'Habitats' has been the focus of science, discussing the devasation humans have caused on the world around us. The Christmas period came to an end on Friday as we celebrated The Epiphany as a whole school. A gentle reminder to ensure your child reads daily, returning their book(s) to school each Friday. Homework and spellings are also to be completed.

Wishing our children and their families a wonderful 2023. This week, we have spoken to our children about how they can make the most of this term and, as always, your support is vital.
