Nursery

This week, Nursery have enjoyed celebrating the Lunar New Year. We learned about the different customs and how Chinese New Year is celebrated by people all over the world. We decorated lanterns, made money envelopes and created dragon masks. We know that lots of decorations and clothes are red because it is a lucky colour! This week's NELI story was 'Don't Wake up Tiger!' The children have spent time learning our new words of the week:

float, hurry, stroke, worry. Look out on MS Teams for the NELI newsletter for more activities you can do at home. The children have loved exploring maths games on our large computer screen, playing a wide variety of counting and number puzzles.

This week we focused on the number 2.

Reception

In Reception, have been learning all about the Lunar New Year and how this is celebrated by people all around the world. In order to prepare for this special celebration, families clean up their homes and decorate them with lanterns to welcome good luck. We spent time cleaning our classroom in the hope it would bring us good luck too! We read the story of 'The Great Race' to understand more about the Chinese zodiac. I2 animals raced across a river in order to have a year named after them. We used language such as; first, second, third and next. The children impressed me with their labelling skills, trying hard to write the name of each animal in their literacy books. This year is the Year of the Rabbit.

<u>Year l</u>

Another busy week in Year I, the children continue to astound me with their hard work! In our maths lessons this week, we have been comparing equations using the = symbol. We even started to find missing numbers! We listened to the story of Simeon and Anna meeting the baby Jesus in the temple in RE, and designed our own candles for our display with Simeon's words 'Jesus is the light of the world'. In English, we designed and described a new spacesuit for Traction Man and thought carefully about transport in the past and present in our history lesson. Thank you to those parents who have booked their place for Parents' Evening, please book on if you haven't done so yet - I can't wait to show you the children's amazing work!

Year 2

Year 2 have had another busy and exciting week. In English, we have started writing our own stories based on 'Orion in the Dark'. I have been so impressed with the progress in the children's writing this half term. In maths, we have focused on time, telling the time to quarter to and quarter past the hour and sequencing the events in the day. In geography, Miss McDonald, our trainee teacher from John Moores University, organised an exciting lesson for our learners where we became immersed in different countries in Europe and explored some of the main landmarks in Europe. Finally, in RE we read the story of 'Zacchaeus the Tax Collector' and described how we can follow God's message and 'Love one another as I have loved you'.

Year 3

What an exciting week in Year 3! Thank you to all our parents and families for attending our class assembly today. It was wonderful to see everyone and I am sure you will join me in congratulating our children in doing so well and making us all so proud. In maths, we have been dividing by 10 and 100 using the place value and grouping strategies. In English, we have planned and written our character description of the girl in 'The Magic Finger'. We also participated in an art masterclass to learn how to draw characters inspired by Quentin Blake, the famous illustrator of our class novel. We definitely have budding artists in class! In RE, we learned about a Gospel used in ordinary time and what it tell us about the life and ministry of Jesus.

Year 4

A wonderful week of learning in Year 4. The children have continued to work tremendously hard in all lessons. In English, the children wrote a diary entry in role as 'Celeste' (the angel from our class novel). In maths, the children have developed an understanding of mixed numbers and improper fractions. We have started our new science topic of 'Classification of Animals'. The children identified the different habitats that animals have and the features that they have to help them thrive in their own habitat. In geography, we used an atlas and online research to identify the individual countries and capital cities on a map. In RE, the children have discussed the role of the church community during the bereavement process.

PE AT ST AMBROSE

We've had lots of fun in PE this week, from brilliant balancing to delightful dodging! Early Years were gymnasts and Year 3 have been pirates in dodgeball. Year 5 made overhead clearances in tennis and Year 6 played long corners in hockey!

Year 5

In Year 5, we have been preparing diary entries from the perspective of characters from our class novel: 'Varjak Paw'. We explored different pronouns and how they are used for 1st or 3rd person. In maths, we have continued our studies of 'Fractions'.

We have been converting fractions to find equivalents. We then applied this knowledge to compare and order them. In RE, we have been exploring the role of a bishop in a local community. We discussed the meaning of a diocese and the symbolism of the different items of clothing that he wears. In science, we investigated the difference between conductors and insulators. We planned an investigation to find out what would be the best material to use to make a teapot.

<u>Year 6</u>

In Year 6, we have been exploring how formal and informal vocabulary can change a text. We have started to plan a formal letter written by one of the characters in 'Journey to Jo'burg'. In maths, we have started to read and explore coordinates across all four quadrants of a graph, using mathematical vocabulary to explain the position of points. In history, we continued to discuss World War One, looking at conscription and the support given to Britain by the colonies. Adaptation of living things was the focus of our science learning; namely how polar bears and cacti have adapted to their environments. We loved our tennis lesson this week, as we improved our reaction to movement across a carousel of activities.

SAFEGUARDING INFORMATION
