Year 1

The children have done themselves proud this week in every single lesson, I am a very lucky teacher!

They are making fantastic progress in their different phonics groups and I can see them beginning to apply their phonic knowledge in their written work

back in class. In English, we wrote a set of instructions for Jack to look after the beanstalk and then followed these instructions to try and grow our own! In maths, we've begun to investigate addition sentences by counting on. We completed our RE topic on Families and the children loved making necklaces which they will bring home next week. Finally, in geography, we walked around our local area and looked at the different landmarks such as the church and shops. I hope everyone has a lovely weekend!

Year 2

We have had another busy but exciting week in year 2. I am so proud of how hard all the children have worked in their lessons. We started the week

by planning our alternative endings to our traditional tale before writing our stories. I am so impressed to see the children applying their phonic knowledge in their written work. In science, we carried out our first investigation looking at the effect that exercise has on our body. We were fascinated to find our pulse and we definitely worked to get our heart rate up. In maths, we have moved onto addition and subtraction using our knowledge of number bonds to 10 to find number bonds to 20. Finally, we had a lovely Collective Worship, where we gave thanks to our family.

Year 3

What a busy and exciting week! It was wonderful to see our parents and families join us for a hot drink and cake in support of Macmillan Coffee Morning and then into our classrooms to join in our maths lesson. Thank you for your kind donations. In mathe this week, we have partitioned 3-digit numbers and practised reading and writing them in words too. I was delighted to read the diary entries we wrote in our English lesson. In science we learned about different muscles and their functions in our body. We had great fun learning about rivers in the UK in our geography lessons and finding features of the River Mersey. Children enjoyed using Google Earth to study the rivers. In R.E, it was wonderful to read Y3's 'Recipe for a Happy Family'. A reminder that all children must bring in a waterproof coat daily.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a very productive week. We have revisited addition and subtraction in maths, and considered how to use derived facts to answer calculations. In English, we have written in the past tense and third person, both features in a newspaper report. During our science lesson, we investigated the impact of food and drink on our teeth. We experimented using eggshells and different liquids. We have continued to develop our class vocals on Thursday during our music lesson with Mr Watson. The childrens confidence is growing each week. Our Collective Worship this week has continued to reflect our RE topic of 'people'. We have considered how the people in our own families and our school families guide us with wisdom. It was lovely to hear some real-life examples given. Year 4 have produced some brilliant work this week. Have a great weekend!

Year 5

We have had a great week in Year 5. In science, we have been learning about the different phases of the moon. All children will be bringing home a 'Moon Journal' to record the lunar activity each night. We continued to study the Anglo-Saxons. We learnt the importance of a Monk called Augustine who was sent by Pope Gregory to convince the Anglo-Saxons to become Christians. He even baptised 10,000 people on Christmas Day! We wrote newspaper reports linked to our book 'Beetle Boy'. We tweeted pictures of our work, which the author herself said were amazing! Thank you to all of the parents and family members who were able to attend our Macmillan Cake Morning today and we hope that you enjoyed taking part in our maths lesson.

<u>Year 6</u>

It has been another busy, yet fruitful week. Children have amazed staff with their mature speeches in their bid for Head Girl and Head Boy. I am so proud of them all! We have continued to read 'Wonder' and have started to develop formal letter writing skills. In maths, we have been multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000 and securing our understanding of factors, multiples and prime numbers. It was lovely to see parents and family members join our maths lesson this morning, as part of our Macmillan Coffee Morning. In history, we have discussed the reasons why pyramids were built and why they were replaced with tombs. In science, we explored what happens to white light as it passes through a glass prism and 'Gummy Bears'! Have a lovely family weekend.

VOLUNTARY ONE-WAY SYSTEM

In our efforts to minimise the risks to our pupils, please be reminded that we follow a voluntary one-way traffic system outside of school. The aim of this system is to increase safety and ease congestion whilst also creating a calmer and efficient school drop off and pick up.

The route is as follows: Approach school via Alder Wood Avenue Turn right on to Alderfield Drive



Park/ stop car before the start of the school railings and let children out kerb-side.

Continue along Alderfield Drive to exit the one-way system or turn right onto Ringsfield Road.

OPAL: OUTDOOR PLAY AND LEARNING

The weather is definitely changing and we are noticing a lot more wet weather. Our aim is to stay outside regardless of the conditional All children, from Reception to Year 6, will need a pair of wellies to be left in class. These should be sent in immediately. As our weather is so unpredictable, please make sure your child comes to school wearing a warm, waterproof coat each day. We are extremely grateful for your support as we develop our OPAL approach. We ask that you remind your children that behaviour on rainy days should be sensible, for example, hoods up and not sitting in puddles whilst in our full uniform.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

All children in Reception, YI and Y2 get free school meals regardless of parents' income. If parents receive certain benefits, school may qualify for extra funding known as Pupil Premium. We need to know that you're entitled to Free School Meals to issue vouchers during school holidays. All parents (NURSERY TO Y6) should complete the online application to apply for free school meals in term-time by following this link:

NURSERY PLACES AVAILABLE

We have spaces available for children aged 3-4 in our Nursery. Children of this age are entitled to 15 hours free provision and we provide this as 3-hour daily sessions (AM 8:45-11:45 or PM 12:30-3:30). you would like to put your child's name down for a space in Nursery, please complete a purple form available from the school office.

Each classes PE days are as follows: Nursery AM & PM - Wednesday, Reception - Wednesday, Year I - Thursday & Friday, Year 2 - Wednesday & Thursday, Year 3 - Monday & Tuesday, Year 4 - Tuesday & Thursday (swimming), Year 5 - Monday & Thursday (swimming), Year 6 - Monday & Friday. Children must wear full school uniform on non-PE days.
