#### Nursery

Outside, we mixed red and yellow powder paint in the rain, to create orange puddles and really enjoyed splashing in them! On Thursday, for National Poetry Day, we watched Michael Rosen perform his poem 'Chocolate Cake' Mmmm! We have also worked extremely hard to use scissors correctly, to make snips in paper.

#### <u>Year l</u>

What a fantastic week in Year I! The children have been amazing this week and have really worked hard. They worked well in PE, practising their throwing skills. In RE, we have been learning about Judaism and listened to stories about Abraham and Moses and how they followed Jesus and trusted in him. Some of the items that they packed for their journey in the desert were astounding! In maths, I've been so impressed with how they have solved addition missing number problems involving three numbers. Their written work in English has been a joy to read. I was also really impressed with the scores in their weekly spelling tests. Keep up the

fantastic work Year I and I hope that you all have a relaxing weekend.

#### <u>Year 2</u>

Another extremely busy week in year 2. I cannot believe how quickly this half-term is going and I am very proud of all the children's hard work. In maths this week, we have started our mastering number programme. This is an exciting learning opportunity provided by the NCETM aimed at developing number fluency in KSI. The children are enjoying our quick sessions and using the Rekenreks. In science, we have been looking at a balanced diet

and sorting food into groups. We were very interested to analyse our own school dinner and see if it was a balanced meal. This week in R.E, we are exploring Judaism and the celebration of Shabbat.

The children have been fascinated to learn the customs of a different religion. Have a lovely weekend!

#### <u>Year 3</u>

In English this week, we have written a character description based on 'Gangsta Granny' by David Walliams. It is wonderful to see how much the children are enjoying the humour in this novel so far. We have been adding 10 and 100 to 3-digit numbers and have begun rounding 2/3-digit numbers to the nearest 10 in maths. As part of studying other faiths in our Come and See curriculum, we have learnt about synagogues in our Judaism topic. In Science, we investigated how muscles and bones work together to help us move. In geography, we identified the source and mouths of rivers in the UK and drew a field sketch of the River Mersey. A reminder that all children must access TT Rockstars daily for at least 15 minutes to learn their timestables. For our spelling homework, children must write these in sentences.

#### <u>Year 4</u>

We have had a great week of learning in Year 4. We have continued to identify the features of a newspaper report in our English lessons. We used this knowledge to create a newspaper article based on Charlotte's Web. In science, the children have been eager to continue our experiment on teeth. We have noticed that vinegar and cordial had the worst effect on the eggshells. In maths, we have developed our understanding of column addition by

increasing our skillset up to 4 digit numbers. Swimming was extra exciting for the children, as they were asked to wear pyjamas in the pool to complete a safety course. Finally, we have all enjoyed learning about the Jewish faith this week in RE. It has been so interesting to consider another faith and look at their traditions and beliefs. Have a lovely weekend!

This week, our Year 3 boys team competed in a football competition. They should be extremely proud of themselves. Congratulations to all of our football stars! #### <u>Year 5</u>

We have had another wonderful week in Year 5! In our maths lessons, we have been learning a range of different addition and subtraction strategies. We used number lines to 'round and adjust' and used 'If I know..., then I also know...' to apply our knowledge of known addition and

subtraction facts to multiples of 10. In English, we wrote instructions about 'How to build a bug hotel'. On Friday, we followed our instructions and created 'bug bottles'. This week we have been learning about Judaism. We read 'The Story of the Exodus' and learnt about how it is celebrated during the Jewish festival of Passover. Have a wonderful weekend Year 5!

#### <u>Year 6</u>

We have had a great week in Year 6! Children have been appointed into roles of responsibility and have faced this new challenge with maturity. We have continued our work on formal letter writing in English and have enjoyed discussing the development of characters within the text. Thursday was National Poetry Day; we read a range of poems and watched Michael Rosen perform his 'Chocolate Cake' poem. In maths, we have been developing strategies for solving word problems using multiplication. In RE, we compared beliefs in Judaism to those of our own faith. We loved the apples and honey, learning about Rosh Hashanah! We have continued to look at the Ancient Egyptians in history and took part in a live zoom with Egyptologist, Dr Bob Brier.
