Nursery

Nursery have had a wonderful start to the half-term! This week we have been reading Julia Donaldson's 'Room on the Broom'. We have listened carefully to the story joining in with our faviourite phrases. We have followed instructions to make toilet roll witches, threaded beads onto broomsticks, made playdough wands and re-told the story by sticking the characters onto a card broom. It has been wonderful to see the children independently re-telling the story with puppets in the reading area. On Tuesday, we took part in a whole school Ccollective Worship with Fr Ed. I am so proud of how well the children sat and joined in.

Reception.

It has been lovely to welcome Reception back after the half-term. This week, we have spent time exploring the story 'Room on the Broom' by Julia Donaldson. When reading the book, the children have enjoyed joining in with some of their favourite phrases and freeze-framing some of the key moments from within the story, We have talked about where the Witch and her animal friends might go to next on their truly magnificient broom! In maths, we have explored repeating patterns of size and colour, as well as singing lots of number rhymes. Year 1

What an exciting first week back after half-term! The children were so excited at the start of the week and it was lovey to hear all about the spooky parties and events they had been to. They have settled back into their lessons very well and have really worked hard this week, especially in science where we have be learning about the seasons - Autumn in particular. In our RE work, we looked at the fabulous Baptism items brought into school and decorated our own baptism candles. In maths, we have been working on repeating patterns and following algorithms. In English, we loved hearing about the 'Jolly Postman's day and wrote our own description of him using some amazing adjectives! Our All Saints' Day Collective Worship was a lovely way to start our week - we hope you liked the prayer cubes.

Year 2

It is lovely to see all of the well rested faces after

our half-term break. We have started the new term off with a bang, learning all about the 'Gunpowder Plot' and 'Guy Fawkes'. We are very excited to welcome our visitors next week and start our new history topic 'The Great Fire of London'.

We celebrated All Saints' Day together as a school with a special Collective Worship in the hall.

Afterwards, we were encouraged to think of how we can all be saints in our daily lives. In maths, we have been looking at solving word problems using a bar model to help us find the difference. In English, we have started reading our new book 'The Promise' and have explored the emotions of the characters using freeze frames. Please remember to return your child's book-bag every Friday.

Year 3

We hope you all had a restful break. It's been lovely to welcome the children back for another exciting half-term. Our classroom has been buzzing with excitement as we have started our new novel; 'Stig of the Dump' in English. We are really enjoying the story so far and it is wonderful to see everyone's enthusiasm. In maths, we have been adding and subracting mentally using different strategies. In RE, we researched our Patron Saint, St Amborse and learned about the Sacrament of Baptism. We have been learning about nutrition and importance of a balanced diet in science and children enjoyed designing their own healthy plate. In geography, we used maps to identify different counties in the UK and researched our local county; Merseyside. Homework must be completed by Friday each week.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a wonderful start to the halfterm! We have started to read our new class book 'The Explorer' and considered how it might feel to be lost in the jungle. In maths, we have deepened our knowledge of multiplication and division using the distributive law. On Tuesday, Fr Ed joined us for Collective Worship focusing on All Saints' Day. We created some thoughtful prayer cubes to show how we can be saints in our own lives. It was great to have another jam-packed Thursday with singing, Spanish and swimming all in one day! It has been amazing to see the children growing in confidence in all three area of learning. Finally, in science, we investigated the digestive system by creating our own replicas using bananas, tights and orange juice! Overall, an exciting first week back! Have a lovely weekend.

If your child turns 4 before 31st August 2023, you can apply online now for a place in Reception. Closing dates for Reception applications are 15th January 2023. All Reception applications should be completed online at www.liverpool.gov.uk/admissions

In addition to the online application, families should also complete the St Ambrose Supplementary Faith Form. This can be accessed via our school website and is available from the school office. We require evidence of baptism in the form of a baptismal certificate handed in to school with our supplementary faith form by the 15th January 2023.
