Year 1

What a fantastic week we've had in Year I this week. The children have really settled and have all worked extremely hard in all of their lessons - Star of the Week was a really tough choice this week! In our English, we wrote character descriptions of The Jolly Postman with some excellent punctuation being used. In maths, we learned about the 'teen' numbers and how they are made up of 'ten and a bit'. This can be a difficult concept to understand and the children did superbly in it! In science, we thought about the weather in autumn and in our history topic, we learned about the different categories of toys and what characteristics they share. We ended our week with a visit to church where Fr Ed told us all about Baptism. Have a fantastic weekend with those that you love.

Year 2

We have had such a lovely and exciting week in Year 2. We welcomed a visitor who helped us explore our history topic 'The Great Fire of London' through drama, It was lovely to see the children express their creative sides. In science, we have started our new topic 'Everyday Materiale'. The children enjoyed getting out in the fresh air on a material hunt to spot the everyday materials we could find. In maths, this week we have started exploring length through standard and non-standard units. In English, we have started our diary entry based on our book 'The Promise', the children have been working hard to include adverbs in their writing. Finally, in RE, we have continued exploring the signs and symbols that might be seen at a Baptism.

Year 3

Another busy week in Year 3. In English, we have written dialogues between Stig and Barney from our class novel. We have used mental strategies to add and subtract 3-digit numbers using multiples of 10 and 100 in maths. We have also used rounding to add and subtract 3-digit by 2-digit numbers. In geography, we explored choices of settlement people make and how land is used in the UK. In RE, we learned about the role of Godparents during Baptism and ways we can let our light shine brightly. We have started our new history topic 'Stone Age to Iron Age' and it's great to see the children's enthusiasm in this topic. I was very impressed with how children have already made a link with Stone Age and Stig from our class novel. We look forward to our cinema visit on Tuesday next week. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 4

What an exciting week we have had in Year 4! We started the week visiting Chester to understand life in Roman Britain and the duties of a Roman soldier. The children loved re-enacting the battles from the soldiers' perspective. In maths, we have begun to consider mental strategies for division, focusing on known facts and partitioning. In English, the children loved creating a set of instructions for 'How to make a map'. Our class book 'The Explorer' tells the story of children lost in the Amazon, This map can help them to explore their surroundings. On Friday, the children followed their own instructions to create a map. In Spanish, we have continued to develop our language skills focusing on school subjects - the children love this part of the week. Finally, in RE, we have continued to discuss the process of confirmation and how we can be guided by the Holy Spirit.

In PE this week, our Early Years classes worked outside, learning to control and manipulate different types of balls! KSI are learning new elements in gymnastics and KS2 have been competing all week in athletics!

Year 5

Another very busy week in Year 5! We have continued to read 'Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone'. This week we have been concentrating on how to create a suspenseful atmosphere in our writing. Through the power of our Wow Room, we visited the Hut on the Rock to inspire our descriptive language. I can't wait to read them, as I know they will have me on the edge of my seat. Thank you all so much again for your amazing support with our class assembly this week. From all of the pictures shared on Teams and Twitter, to the time spent at home rehearsing lines, it really does mean a lot to myself and the children. The turn out for the assembly on Friday morning was wonderful! Have a fantastic weekend.

Year 6

We have had a great week in Year 6 continuing to read our class book, 'A Monster Calls'. In English, we have been learning how to apply spelling rules to improve our descriptive writing. In maths, we have been generating and describing linear number sentences. We have been discussing Global Challenges in geography and how natural resources should be conserved. To demonstrate classification, (our science topic) we collected a range of leaves and classified them according to certain characteristics. Music was great fun as always. We have started to rehearse a number of Christmas Carols to sing in the Cathedral this term. Finally, a gentle reminder to encourage your child to read and return their books each week and to complete homework by Friday.
